IF the NIRB's Final Hearing Report recommends approval of the Project AND IF the Minister accepts the NIRB's recommendation and approves the Project, the NIRB will be required to issue a **Project Certificate**.


What to Expect



- Issues to be decided at the Hearing:
 - In the coming week, the NIRB will formulate and distribute a listing of key issues to be decided at the Final Hearing
 - Other issues as identified in final written submissions will also be considered
- NIRB has provided an indication of parties expected to attend
- Public notice of Final Hearing will be published in the coming week
 - Will contain direction and timeline for requests for intervenor status



- Submissions from Parties due May 30
- Direction on format provided April 27
 - Executive Summary in English & Inuktitut
 - 7 Table of Contents
 - Introduction
 - Specific comments
 - Recommendations
- It is recommended that, where possible, technical submissions be accompanied by a statement setting out the technical qualifications of the persons who prepared it
- If additional items are resolved post-submissions and prior to the Final Hearing, additional statements may be filed



- Final Hearing is chaired by the NIRB Chairperson with all board members present
- Simultaneous English-Inuktitut interpretation throughout
 - French also available upon request in advance
- Hearing transcripts will be prepared
- Entire public registry will be available
- Presenters will be sworn in
- Presenters should expect to respond to questions



- First 3 days of Final Hearing in Iqaluit and first day in each Igloolik and Pond Inlet will focus on technical presentations
 - Purpose is for parties to provide technical evidence to the Board for consideration
 - Summary presentations in Igloolik and Pond Inlet
- All technical presentations to be provided in English and Inuktitut
- Technical presentations to be provided to NIRB in advance of the Hearing on or before July 10
 - Will serve as formal exhibit filing of additional materials at Final Hearing can be done as necessary
- All parties are asked to bring sufficient copies of printed presentations for hearing participants and the public
 - Anticipate approx. 100-200 participants per venue



- Community Roundtables will allow for questioning of the Proponent and parties by community members to elicit comments, concerns and perspectives
- The NIRB will be soliciting up to five (5) representatives from each of the 11 communities to attend the Final Hearing in Igaluit:
 - Community reps will attend all proceedings and will directly engage in discussions during 2 day community roundtable
 - Community roundtables in Igloolik and Pond Inlet will be structured for local residents
- NIRB staff will be organizing additional community information sessions in Igloolik and Pond Inlet in advance of the Final Hearing to promote public awareness and participation
